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MEMS AND MOTES

The next Yamato movie has had it's release date changed to March of 1983. The name will be Final Yamato and will be the "last" movie in the series. This next movie will be shoot in 70mm. The movie will take place in the year 2203, and will deal with a planet called "Aquarius". While it is being billed as "the final Yamato movie" fans will remember that Arrivederchi Yamato had the same type of publicity. Perhaps this

movie will be done along a "what if" story line, also known as "entropy".

The thrid season of Star Blazers will be out later than expected. In fact the chances of having the new season out for the Fall season is very dim at this point. Also the chances are good that a merchandising campaign won't be out until the thrid season is in the market. In Philadelphia Star Blazers is now in the same time slot as Star Trek, but it won't be till the rating results that we will know which is pulling in the largest audience, and if one show is hurting the other. One fan commented that this was the worst thing to happen since the competition between Star Trek and Space: 1999. We urge all local fans to write both stations to chance the time slots. In New York WPIX-TV has announced that it will not pick up Star Blazers for the Fall season. Right now Star Blazers Long Island is starting a campaign.

The fandom surrounding Star Blazers (called Blazerdom in some circles) has been growing. Right now there are two "mini cons" in the works. Star Blazers Mini Con (also known unofficialy as Star Blazers Conclave) will be held as a part of the Creation Summer Expo*N.Y. It will take place August 28-29th at the New York Statler, at 33rd & 7th Ave. in Manhattan. Admision for both days is \$12, for Saturday \$7 and Sunday \$6. Advance tickets cost less, \$10 for both days, and \$5.25 a day. Payments for tickets and all hotel info should be sent to Creation. For info on the full convention call

the Final Yamato

The curtain of secrecy surrounding the final Space Cruiser Yamato movie has been lifted at last! The title, long rumored to be Yamato Towards Eternity is actually Space Cruiser Yamato - The Concluding Chapter. For those who don't relish the idea of trying to pick out the title in Japanese, don't worry - the movie's title in English is printed as Final Yamato:

Toei, the distributer, announces that the movie will be released in Japan during March of 1983, a full seven months later than the fans expected. Fortunately, part of the storyline has been revealed. It's vague, but it's a taste of the epic

to come in 1983.

According to the legends of space, when the Earth was bern 4 billion years ago, a huge planet of water called Aquarius passed by it. The interference of Aquarius' gravity caused huge amounts of water to rain down on Earth. The oceans it formed raised to life. But in the Paleozoic era Aquarius passed Earth again, this time removing some excess water and killing of the dinosaurs.

The year is 2203 A.D. Aquarius' orbit is bringing it toward our galaxy again. But the speed and power of the planet's passing affects a nebula, which undergoes a dimention dislocation and ends up covering parts of our galaxy. The Nucleus Fixed Star System ends up opposite Earth, and Earth Defence Command sends Yamato to investigate.

* The core of Aquarius is made up of heavy water, and above it's surface of it's sea is a floating continent. Long ago there was a civilization, but now the Queen of

Aquarius lives alone in ruins.

But instead of finding the planet, the Yamato gets lost on the way. They find a planet, Deingil, with all of its land covered with water from Aquarius. Dengil's leader, Lugar, wants to claim the new planet for his people, and Deingil science has developed the most powerful space fleet fot Lugar to use.

Yamato's crew lears that Aquarius is now heading right for Earth, so they leave Deingil and try to find their way back home. But suddenly, a strange fleet attacks ...

Desslok will be in Final Yamato too, as his Garuman-Gamilon Empire squares off against the Bolar Commonwealth - maybe in the Nucleus Fixed Star System? - to start the war that ends in the Yamato III/Star Blazers 3rd season. However the Final Yamato takes place in 2203 A.D. If it's the absolutely last chapter, then how does the Yamato III series of 2205 A.D. fit in? Maybe Yamato III is a "what if" series like Arrivederchi Yamato. There are still scores of questions to be answered.

Final Yamato will require 20 months to complete. It's being filmed in 70mm, like the second half of Be Forever Yamato, yet there is no word as to whether it will have quadraphonic sound like it's predecessor. As usual Hiroshi Miyagawa will be writing the music. But to add something of a classical touch the music of Debussy will be used in scene of planet Aquarius, and Wagner for the planet Deingil. A music & narration album a prototype of the movie, has just been released by Nippon Columbia. Entitled Space Cruiser Yamato Prologue to the Final, and a just plain Yamato Final on the cover. A few record shops in the U.S. should have it by mid-August, and the price should be from \$14.95 and \$19.98, depending on who you order from. 


